

BISA PRIMARY POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR

We want everyone at Braeburn to be happy and safe. To help this, we have some rules about how we should behave.

We expect everyone to be kind and respectful to each other. We should also listen to our teachers and follow their instructions. It is important to tell the truth and be honest, and to try our best in everything we do.

It is important for us to learn to be responsible for our actions. This means we need to think about what we are doing and how it affects others. We should try to make good choices and help to create a positive, caring and encouraging environment.

When we behave well and show good attitudes, we are rewarded and recognised. We might get verbal encouragement, be recognised in front of our peers and others, get Golden Time, house points, or even the 'Spotty Tie'!

If we misbehave, we may get a warning or a consequence. The consequence will depend on how serious what we did was.

For small things, like talking out of turn or forgetting your homework, you might get a verbal warning. This means that your teacher will talk to you about what you did wrong and ask you not to do it again.

For more serious things, like refusing to follow instructions or being disruptive in class, you might get a break time detention. This means that you will have to stay in at break time and sit quietly. You might also be sent to your Key Stage Leader, or your parents might be informed.

For very serious things, like bullying or damaging property, you might have to replace or fix the damage, or you might be sent to the Head of Primary. Your parents might also be informed by letter.

For the most serious things, like fighting or threatening staff, your parents might be invited to school, you might be placed on report, or you might be suspended. This means that you would not be allowed to come to school for a period of time.
